


A Titan's Creed Approved by TCA Board

During the course of the 2013-2014 school year the Character, Culture, Curriculum, and Instruction (CCCI) department has worked with numerous stakeholders at TCA – students, parents, staff at all grade levels, administration, and the Academic Lead Team to create a TCA touchstone document (first mentioned in Volume 2 of the PALMARIUM). The goal was to create a clear statement of what we strive for at TCA that could be embraced by all students, staff, and parents. The intent was not to replace the mission statement, or in any way diminish the core values, but rather have a document that embodies the essence of who we are that is actionable in our daily endeavors. The final document after much thought, review, and reflection (*included on the next page*), was approved by the TCA

Board of Directors on Monday, March 10. As we progressed through the stages of development it became apparent that the touchstone embodies *A Titan's Creed*. During the remainder of the 2013-2014 academic year and as we move into the next school year you will see a dedicated effort to emphasize the creed through a variety of school venues. The support by students, staff, and administration has been extremely positive throughout the entire effort and we encourage all of TCA to embrace this powerful statement.

A Daily Desk Reminder: The Hand of a Difference Maker

We all have items that sit on our desks, or otherwise reside in our work areas, that may seem unusual to others. Framed photos and items created by your children usually do not cause anyone to wonder about the origin of the item, but at other times there are sentimental or thought provoking objects that fill our surroundings that beg for conversation. One such item on the desk in my office is a casting of Abraham Lincoln's right hand. A couple have asked me about it, but for the most part it sits there as a personal reminder to me - a reminder of the president that every class I taught for seven years at TCA in U.S. History has rated as our greatest president. Lincoln is the most written about American ever, with an estimated 15,000 books dedicated to some element of his life. Sometimes the hand makes me sit back and think of his impact – the reach of his life even today – and the difficult decisions he faced and how he handled them. The word *meditate* derives from the Latin *meditari* which means: to reflect upon, to contemplate, plan. If nothing more than a small item of connection, something that makes us pause, even momentarily, those mementoes serve a valuable purpose – *reflection*.

ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S HANDS

"Sculptor Leonard Volk took the castings of Lincoln's hands at Lincoln's home in Springfield in late May 1860. Lincoln had just won the Republican nomination for President, and Volk was already thinking of using these castings, in combination with his recently completed Lincoln bust, to fashion a full-length statue. Lincoln's right hand grasps a section of broom handle that he himself obligingly fetched from a shed when the artist expressed a desire to have him hold something. When Lincoln began smoothing the raw edges of the sawn piece, Volk told him that it really was unnecessary, to which Lincoln replied, 'I thought I would like to have it nice.'"
