Reading Advice

In the book, <u>Overcoming Dyslexia</u>, Sally Shaywitz gives this practical reading suggestion:

"I recommend reading with your child as often as possible, at least several evenings a week. Part of that time should be devoted to hearing your child read to you. Listening to your child read prevents a problem from developing without your knowledge; moreover, it's fun."

Multiplication Game - "Shoot 'em"

Place a stack of multiplication facts (face down) in front of both players. At "go", each player picks up a card and places it on their forehead facing their opponent. The first player to correctly answer their opponent's fact gets to keep the card. The player only gets one "shot" to answer per card, so they need to make sure they are accurate. The player with the most cards at the end wins. **Keep practicing those X facts!**
