Spelling This week we will enter list 19 into our spelling books with our test on Thursday. It will include a written narration of rule 9.

<u>Math</u>— We finish chapter 11, Area and Perimeter with the test will be Tuesday, February 27. The TCA East webpage has an explanation of how we teach these concepts. There is a link to the left below.

Writing— Students will independently create an inventive writing piece on a topic of their choice this week.

Reading— We are reading <u>Pollyanna</u> by Eleanor H. Porter in literature class. Our read aloud book is <u>Little Britches</u> by Ralph Moody.

<u>History</u>— In history, we will learn about the Boston Massacre and the Boston Tea Party.

<u>Science</u>– We have begun our unit on Exploring Maps and World Mountains.

<u>Grammar</u>- In our <u>Fix It! Grammar</u>, students will identify the coordinating conjunctions. Ask your child what a FANBOY is. They continue to copy *The Nose Tree* in their notebooks.

Poetry Monthly Recitation-

This week all students will recitation a portion of Patrick Henry's speech, which was given in March 1775 at the Second Virginia Convention. A copy of the speech is on the TCA website, and each student was given a copy.

Rule 9

Words with 1 syllable and 1 vowel followed by 1 consonant must double the last letter before adding an ending that begins with a vowel.

1-1-1 rule

Examples: hopping, written
