### **Habits and Areas of Study**

While the children have each come into Second Grade with their own strengths, talents, and abilities, it is important for us not to "capitalize on what is already deemed a strength, neglecting areas in need of real maturation." (When Children Love to Learn, pg.88) In this process, strengths are built upon and weaknesses are developed in an effort to help each child to become a well-rounded individual. Our goal is to form relationships with the children while instilling in them habits that will help them. "In focusing on performance alone, the child can fall into lines of thought that lead to perfectionism, competitiveness, obsessiveness, guilt, and depression." (When Children Love to Learn, pg.99) Therefore, at school we will focus on the child as a whole and introduce habits as the need arises. Lately, we've been working on attention, self-discipline, respect, responsibility, remembering, and neatness and order. Habits take time to form, so during those times when a habit is not being practiced as it should be, the child does not experience humiliation or contrived punishments, but instead natural consequences.

As Ms. Mason did, we use "the following steps ordered by St. Augustine as a motto to rise above the faults and weaknesses to higher things in the formation of habits:"

- "I am. " We have the power of knowing ourselves
- "I can." We are conscious of power to do what we perceive we ought to do."
- "I ought." We have within us a moral judge to whom we feel ourselves subject, who points out and requires of us our duty."
- "I will." We determine to exercise that power with a volition that is in itself a step in the execution of what we will."
  (When Children Love to Learn, p. 88)

## **Birthdays**

We look forward to celebrating birthdays in our classroom. If your child would like to celebrate a birthday, feel free to have him/her bring in a class treat for the special day. Please email or call your teacher at least a week in advance to discuss plans. Please bring 20 of the same thing (check with your child's teacher to see if there are any allergies in the class).

If you are going to have your child pass out birthday invitations at school, make sure all children are invited (or all girls/boys). If you are only inviting a few, please do so outside of school hours as we will not be able to hand them out during the day.

## Purple Homework Folder / Blue Math Folder

The purple and the blue math homework folders should come home with your child daily. Please **check them every night** for any important paper correspondence as well as homework.

On most days, we complete a Saxon math lesson. We typically complete side A together in class, and time permitting, the students may start side B individually. If your child brings home an incomplete Side B, please allow your child to complete it to ensure he or she understands the concepts. If your child really struggles with a particular concept, please communicate that with their teacher via email or circle the concept and write the teacher a note on the math sheet. Math homework is due back the day after the lesson has been taught.
