Course Overview:

At the advance level, students work much more independently. Students polish the methodologies, techniques learned previously, and push their knowledge of the Elements of Art and Principles of Design. It is crucial that students begin to delve into the theoretical concerns which underlie a successful practice. At the beginning of each project the student will pick a medium that best expresses their focus.

Expectations:

To successfully complete this class, students will:

- Report on time, being attentive, ready to work as instructed.
- Be honest and respectful of our time, others, and themselves.
- Be responsible as an artist in the habits, use of the art equipment, and in clean up.
- Use their time wisely to successfully complete and meet all deadlines.
- Participate fully in discussions and exercises without being prompted.
- Strive to improve through practice, and exploration of various methodologies, and critiques.
- Have no phones, ear buds, or electronics out at any time in the classroom.
- Have no homework out for other classes during class time.
- Have no food or drink in the classroom except water.

Sketchbook:

All students will be expected to keep and bring a sketchbook every day. The sketchbook or "inspirational" book, should be an extension of student's personality as an artist. They are for creating interesting surfaces to draw or to inspire the student. It will be used for warm ups, thumbnails, practice, research, and gallery visits. A total of about 70 pages will be assigned to the students for this class. All sketchbook pages must be numbered when turned in. This syllabus along with the project list should be placed into the sketchbook.

Grading:

Students are graded, using TCA grading scale, on projects, assignments, and class-room habits in art class; with projects carrying the most weight about 60%. The projects and assignments will be graded on their neatness, originality, technique, effort, and delivery of art project or sketchbook. Classroom habits is graded on habits as an artist, involvement in class without being prompted, and willingness to explore the project. It is the responsibility of the students to take ownership in meeting the deadlines, and if needed, having conversations with the teacher to determine if a late penalty will be applied. TCA attendance and late policy will be followed.

First Project:

Ideological Commentary

Students will be introduced to the idea of communication complex ideology through imagery. The students will make an editorial work displaying their personal stance on an issue. They will help to develop both their knowledge base and interpretive skills.

Archetypal Exploration

The students will explore symbols and delve into the meanings and artistic uses of archetypes. The students will research three different types of archetypes. Atleast two of these will be chosen to develop an artwork around.

Personal Exploration

Students will continue their exploration of symbolism. In this assignment students will begin to pick apart their own personal symbolic languages. Students will then construct an artwork using imagery which has symbolic and personal meaning. This work will build the ideas of previous assignments.

First Project:

Deconstruction

The students will find an object preferably something iconic or archetypal and disassemble it. The students will then analyze the object and then reassemble it, using elements of art and principles of design. The artwork will incorporate elements of the original object.

Second Project:

Satire and Manipulation

Students will explore the use of satire. Students will approach this assignment much like ideological artwork of the previous semester. They will first choose a subject about which they feel passionate. This subject must be a current topic and should not be a historical matter. The students will use this subject to construct the piece.

Third Project:

Philosophical Commentary/Experimentation

The students will be asked to build an artwork framed around a philosophical statement which the students find meaningful. To accomplish this, students must first research various philosophers and find a statement cogent enough to inspire them. This philosophical "truth" will be used to inform all design decisions.
