## Course Title: French 4

Grade: Ultimate Level

Textbook: None. A variety of books, plays and films will be used as source texts.

## **Course Description**

This is an advanced elective designed to further complement the required French courses in high school. The focus has moved from the grammar level to a rhetoric level exploration of literature, film, poetry and theater. We will explore everything from fairy tales to philosophy to literary theory to film critique, all in the original French language. Some review of the grammar will be necessary, but the direction of the course is primarily one of culture and exploration of the francophone world.

At the end of the year students will be able to...

- carry on a nuanced discussion of French art and literature in French.
- understand French philosophy and culture.
- be able to read and write fluently in French.
- be impressive at dinner parties.
