School Fee	Replacement Lock for Locker	\$15	To cover the cost of a replacement lock. ²
Athletics Fee	JH: All Sports	\$115 per season	To cover a portion of the operational costs of the athletic programs. ⁴
Athletics Fee	JH: Sports Late Registration Fee	\$15	To cover the operational costs of late registration. ⁴
Athletics Fee	Athletic gear	Varies by sport - communicated with parents by Activity Office	To cover the cost of personal athletic gear. ⁴ Students retain the gear after the season is completed.
