Dress-up Days

Constitution Day

The children are encouraged to dress up in simple colonial costumes. The children will put on a short program for the parents at the end of the day.

Pioneer Day

The children may dress up like pioneers in the 1800s. We will need parent volunteers throughout the day. The children will participate in many pioneer activities all day. We need you to send in frozen orange juice concentrate can lids and parent volunteers to sew dolls and doll clothes for special projects we do on this day.
