NEW and STILL IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

1. THIS WEEK! FRIDAY MAKE-UP DAY for MONDAY STUDENTS ONLY - Friday, January 19th. Due to Martin Luther King, Jr., Day on Monday, January 15th, there is no school for Monday students.

These students will have school on Friday of that week instead. **All Monday students are permitted to wear denim bottoms (no holes or tears) and a uniform top on this day, and all students in grades 2, 4, and 6 need to bring a lunch from home as no hot lunch is served on Fridays.** (Kindergarten schedule is normal with an 11:30 AM dismissal time.) Carpool will go very quickly on this day since our students will be the only ones out at carpool at both 11:30 (for kindergarten) and at 3:30 (for grades 2, 4, and 6).

3. NOON DISMISSAL, WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 7 - All Wednesday students in grades 1, 3, and 5 will be dismissed at noon on Wednesday, February 7th, due to a CSP teacher in-service. (Kindergarten schedule is normal with an 11:30 AM dismissal time.) ALL CSP students (including kindergarteners) are permitted to wear denim bottoms and a uniform top on noon dismissal days. Students in grades 1, 3, and 5 will **not** have lunch on this day. Carpool will go very quickly for students in grades 1, 3, and 5 since they will be the only ones releasing at noon.

4. TALENT SHOW AUDITIONS, FEBRUARY 12 AND 15 - The annual Talent Show is approaching! Students from 2nd through 6th grade are welcome to audition. A student from CSP must be in the act, but CSP students may include Mom, Dad, siblings, or friends in the act with them. Auditions will be held in room 126, Gold Hallway. 5. Our next SAC (School Accountability Committee) meeting will be on Tuesday, February 13, 10 - 11 AM in the TCA East Conference Room (childcare not provided). Meetings are held each quarter throughout the year with the purpose of discussing budget priorities, safety, the school improvement plan, and other items pertaining to the operation of both CSP and CP. Anyone is welcome to attend.

6. CSP OPTIONAL STANDARDIZED TESTING FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES 3 AND 5 - All students in grades 3 and 5 will be sent home with information this week about upcoming standardized testing options. The state of Colorado requires that home school students complete a nationally standardized test in the "odd" numbered grades beginning with third grade. The information being sent home provides details about the testing offered at CSP as well other testing options should you choose not to test through CSP. (An electronic version of this information will also be emailed to all 3rd and 5th grade families by the end of the week.) A practice test packet will be made available to any families who request it (whether a student tests with us or not). These packets may be requested from your child's teacher starting the week of January 22nd.

7. TCA High School's theatre will be performing The Musical Comedy Murders of 1940 on February 1st thru February 3rd at 7:00 pm. 8. D20 Choice Information - Each year, D20 offers choice enrollment opportunities beginning in January for the upcoming school year. TCA is not a D20 choice option. We are a waitlist school and currently enrolled students automatically move on to the next grade level each year. **If your child is enrolled at TCA, and you want to remain at TCA, do NOT submit a D20 Choice application**

for another school. If you apply and receive the choice, your child will be automatically withdrawn from TCA. Per policy, you will not be able to change your mind about staying at TCA.

SNOW DAY AND 2-HOUR DELAY POLICY

Winter weather will undoubtedly impact the school week at some point in the coming months, so I wanted to send out CSP's snow day and 2-hour delay policy. As a reminder, TCA follows D20's delay and closure status.

SNOW DAYS

CSP will follow Academy School District 20 closure status. When ASD20 administration cancels school due to inclement weather, several radio/TV stations will be contacted to broadcast the closure or delay. TCA uses the Blackboard Connect™ service to notify the TCA community in the event of a delay or closure COTTAGE SCHOOL PROGRAM DOES NOT MAKE UP SNOW DAYS.

2-HOUR DELAYS

Periodically throughout the winter, school will be delayed two hours due to inclement weather. Students may wear blue denim on these days. Hot lunch will still be available on delay days, or students may bring a sack lunch. All students should bring a snack and water bottle. Carpool as usual.

Grades 1-6: 10:15 - 3:30 pm

Kindergarten: AM class—10:15 - 12:30 pm

Typing Pal Log-In Instructions (Grades 3-6)

Typing Pal is a learn-to-type program that we offer at no charge to all of our upper elementary students. There is no requirement to participate; it's simply something families may use as part of their home school curricula if students desire to learn/master basic typing skills. Log-in instructions are below.

1. Go to <https://clascott.typingpal.com>
2. Each student's **user name** is the first letter of his/her first name (as given in Infinite Campus; not a nickname) followed by the student's last name (i.e. shille would be the username for Stefani Hille).
3. The **password** is identical for each student—*titans*—UNLESS a student was with us previously and changed his/her account to a unique password. Once students are logged in, they may change their password to something unique to them.
