Studies have been done that show teachers' and parents' quick rescue efforts can actually cause students more hardship than good. If we "rescue" students as soon as they

come across a difficult. problem or task, they never develop the skills to work through a tough problem on their own. As you continue to work with your student this year, keep this in mind. While we don't want students to give up, we want to push them a little bit in their thinking and be slower in "rescue" efforts. It is vital that students develop in their grit. We want every student to be able to persevere and give their best during a difficult task!
